- The loss, injury or death of any animal (including birds) exhibited, whether caused by, or attributable to, the negligence of the Society, or its servants or agents, or otherwise howsoever;
- Any loss or damage occasioned to or by any property exhibited, whether caused by, or attributable to, the negligence of the Society, or its servants or agents, or otherwise howsoever;
- Any injury or damage occasioned to any other animal or property exhibited, or to any other exhibitor, or to the general public, whether caused by, or attributable to, the negligence of the Society, or its servants or agents, or otherwise howsoever;
- Any loss or damage suffered by any exhibitor as a result of any disease contracted or suffered by any animals (including birds) after, or as a consequence of any animal exhibits, or their progeny, being brought to the Showgrounds.

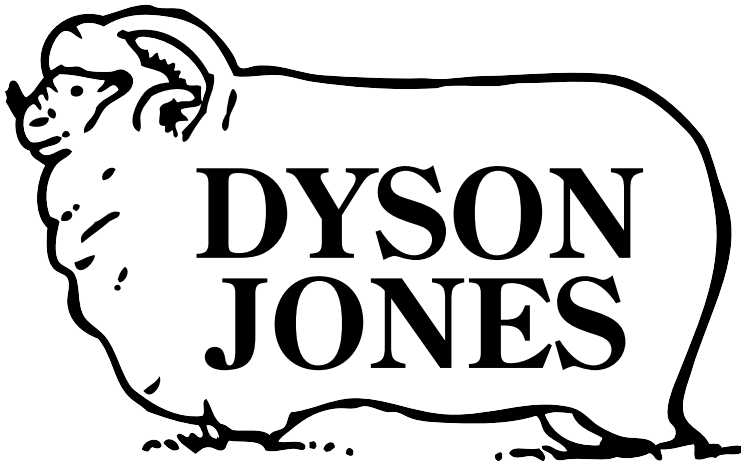

7. <b>Density:</b> Compactness of growth, bulk and breadth of staple for type.	16 points

Breeding Year to be calculated from August 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. HELPER DUTIES ARE A REQUIREMENT IN SOME SECTIONS. **All riders must be affiliated with Pony Club or Equestrian Australia, Day Membership available through PCWA (Membership number needed to enter on Nominate).** **NO STALLIONS IN THE RIDDEN CLASSES.** Plaiting is optional. 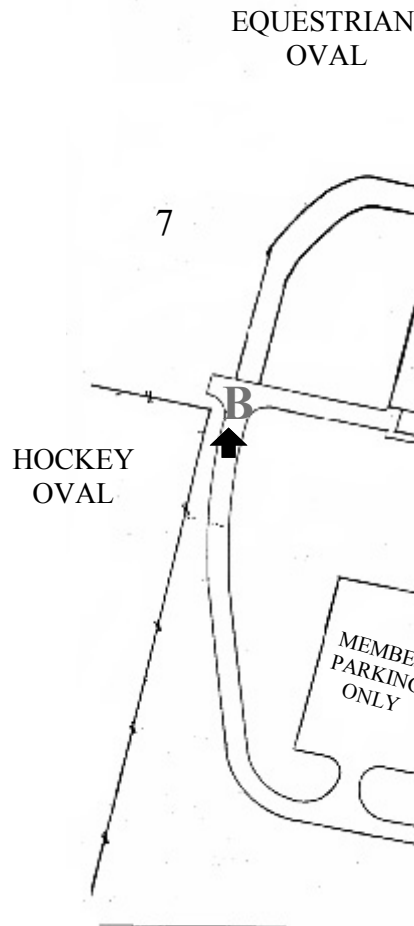

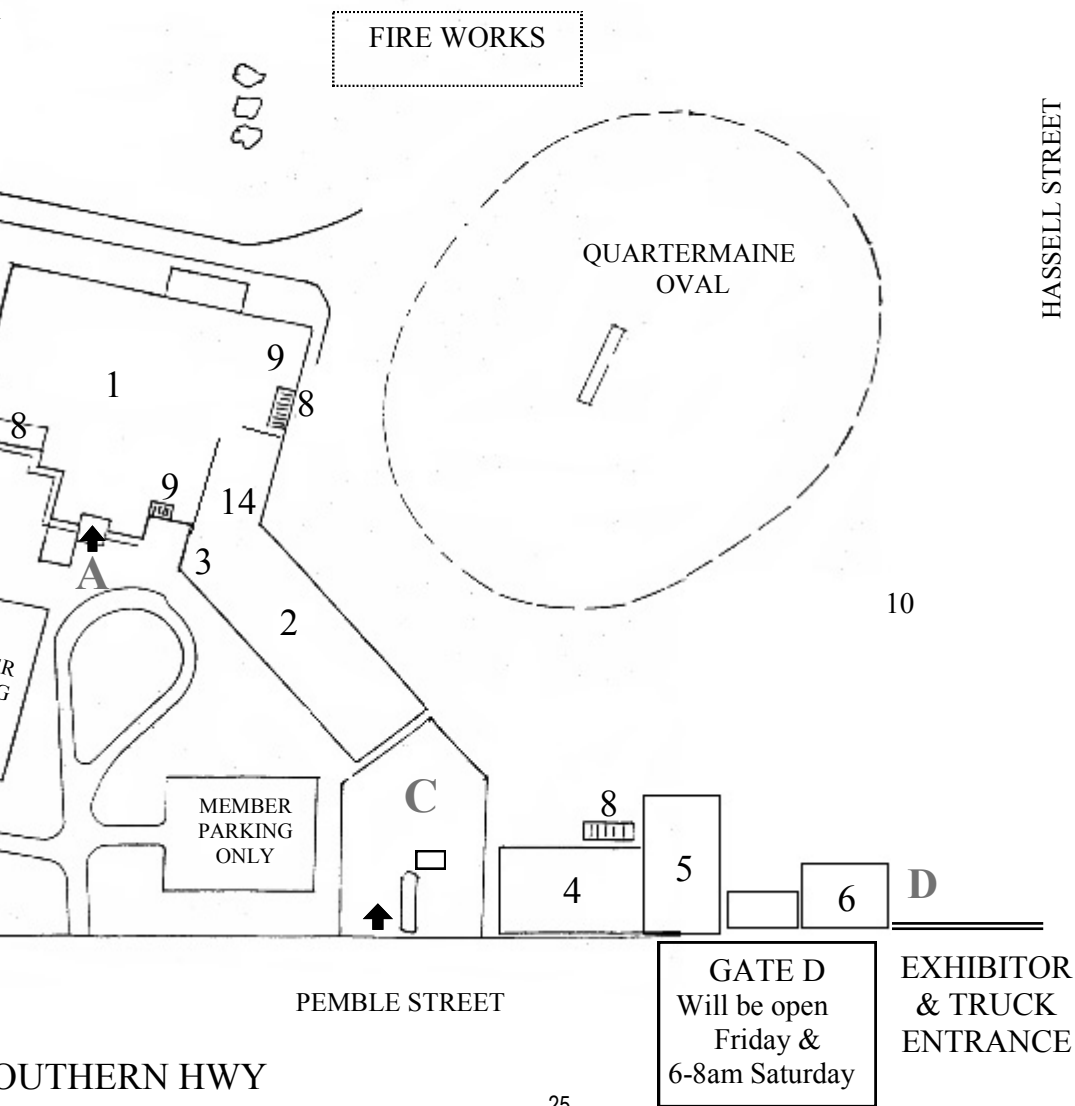

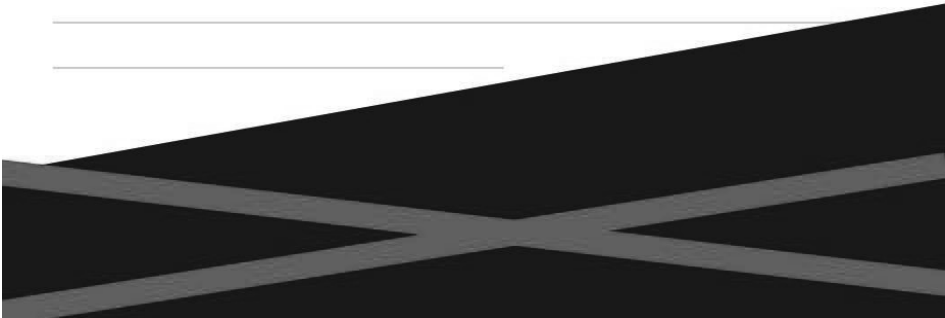
